**A BILL**

To authorize an additional period of beach nourishment for a certain Corps of Engineers project, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Tybee Island Storm  
5 Risk Management Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds that—

8 (1) Tybee Island, Georgia, has been one of the  
9 most prominent tourist destinations in the State of  
10 Georgia since the 1870s;

1           (2) Tybee Island is the most densely developed  
2           barrier island in the State of Georgia and has experi-  
3           enced 10 inches of sea-level rise since 1935;

4           (3) according to a 2016 report funded by the  
5           National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration,  
6           Tybee Island, Georgia, is a “national leader in cli-  
7           mate adaptation planning and coastal resilience”;  
8           and

9           (4) the beach nourishment project referred to in  
10          section 3 is critical to protecting Tybee Island, Geor-  
11          gia, from sea level rise, storm surge, coastal flood-  
12          ing, and related climate change impacts.

13 **SEC. 3. TYBEE ISLAND, GEORGIA.**

14          Notwithstanding the time limitation under section  
15          156(a) of the Water Resources Development Act of 1976  
16          (42 U.S.C. 1962d–5f(a)), the Secretary of the Army may  
17          continue periodic beach nourishment for the project for  
18          coastal storm risk management, Tybee Island, Georgia,  
19          authorized by section 201 of the Flood Control Act of  
20          1965 (42 U.S.C. 1962d–5), for an additional period of 50  
21          years, beginning on the day after the last day of the final  
22          period of periodic nourishment for the project authorized  
23          before the date of enactment of this Act.
