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**A BILL**

To direct the Office for Victims of Crime of the Department of Justice to implement anti-trafficking recommendations of the Government Accountability Office.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Preventing Child Traf-  
5 ficking Act of 2024”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7 In this Act, the term “anti-trafficking recommenda-  
8 tions” means the recommendations set forth in the report  
9 of the Government Accountability Office entitled “Child

1 Trafficking: Addressing Challenges to Public Awareness  
2 and Survivor Support”, which was published on December  
3 11, 2023.

4 **SEC. 3. IMPLEMENTATION OF ANTI-TRAFFICKING PRO-**  
5 **GRAMS FOR CHILDREN.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the  
7 date of the enactment of this Act, the Office for Victims  
8 of Crime of the Department of Justice, in coordination  
9 with the Office on Trafficking in Persons of the Adminis-  
10 tration for Children and Families, shall implement the  
11 anti-trafficking recommendations.

12 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 60 days after the date  
13 on which the Office for Victims of Crime implements the  
14 anti-trafficking recommendations pursuant to subsection  
15 (a), the Director of the Office for Victims of Crime shall  
16 submit a report to the Committee on the Judiciary of the  
17 Senate and Committee on the Judiciary of the House of  
18 Representatives that explicitly describes the steps taken  
19 by the Office to complete such implementation.
