Dear Postmaster General DeJoy,

As we have discussed continuously this year, it is urgent that the service performance of the U.S. Postal Service improve for Georgians and people across the country. I continue to hear from Georgia families and businesses about the difficulty they face sending and receiving their mail.

Today, I specifically write to raise to your attention how the Postal Service's issues in Georgia continue to negatively impact health care for veterans. In addition to issues with receiving prescription medications over the mail, I have heard from constituents that notices from Veterans Affairs Medical Clinics are not being delivered in a timely manner. These notices with time-sensitive information, such as appointment information, must be delivered on time.

Access to medical information in a timely manner is vital for the wellbeing and health of all veterans who serve our nation.

I urge you to investigate these issues specific to veterans' healthcare. Please also provide me an update on the current on-time delivery statistics in Georgia by January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025. I look forward to your prompt response.
